MCA to host 21Minus, youth program focused on teens, on June 15

CHICAGO—The Museum of Contemporary Art (MCA) Chicago is excited to announce its 2024 iteration of <u>21Minus</u>, themed Love & Liberation, which will take place on June 15, 2024, from 1–6 pm. During 21Minus, museum admission is free for people ages 21 and under and their families.

"For over a decade, this art festival has empowered youth," Lead Artist Miguel Limon said. "This year's 21Minus, inspired by exhibitions such as Nicole Eisenman's *What Happened* and Arthur Jafa's work, reflects the teens' needs, activating the MCA with their voices."

A celebration of creativity curated by Chicago teens for Chicago teens, 21Minus is an annual takeover of the MCA that showcases performances, workshops, art installations, film screenings, and more. Organized by the MCA's <u>Teen Creative Agency (TCA)</u>, 21Minus invites visitors to engage with the museum and others in unexpected, exciting ways.

This year, participating youth artists will display work that considers different forms of love and care, and their impact. Visitors will be invited to explore art made by young people on all levels of the museum, watch performances, participate in giveaways of TCA merchandise, and engage in various art making activities including a photobooth, button making and paper weaving. Health-related resources provided by Lurie's Adolescent & Young Adult Medicine and Asian Health Collective will also be available for families.

"The Teen Creative Agency has curated an exhibition inspired by feminist writer and thinker bell hooks. Urgently, the teens tell us that love and domination cannot co-exist, and that ensuring the freedom and dignity of all people is a joyous project that we are all invited to take part in," said Lead Artist Olive Stefanski.

"As a former member of the Teen Creative Agency and participant in 21Minus, I am grateful that the MCA offers space and resources for young artists to express their ideas and artistic responses to contemporary issues," said TCA Apprentice Ari Karafiol. "Cultural institutions must take the voices and perspectives of young people seriously to remain culturally responsive and responsible to their communities."

The <u>Teen Creative Agency</u> is the Museum of Contemporary Art's cultural leadership program for teens ages 15–19 years old. TCA members come together from all over the Chicago area to gain access to artistic resources and transform the MCA into a place that builds community, namely through events like Zinefest and 21Minus.

21Minus is a one-day showcase curated and produced by TCA with support from Lead Artists Olive Stefanski and Miguel Limon, TCA Apprentice Ari Karafiol, and Ahmad Bracey, Manager of Youth and Schools.
